The State Agency on Intellectual Property of the Republic of Moldova ([AGEPI](#) [1]) has adopted and published Practice Paper on the criteria for assessing the disclosure of designs on the internet and to provide recommendations thereof.

The practice paper provides a clear and comprehensive explanation of the principles on which the practice is based, which will be generally applied by AGEPI and the IP offices of the European Union Intellectual Property Network ([EUIPN](#) [2]). They also aim to cover a majority of cases.

The main purpose of this Practice Paper's publication is to increase transparency, legal certainty and predictability for the benefit of the users and examiners of the different IP offices. It is also intended as a point of reference for these and any other interested parties.

The practice paper has been made available to the public in Romanian and English. The document is divided into two parts; the first part summarises the criteria, while the second part provides a complete explanation of the specific criteria applicable in each case.

This achievement has been made possible thanks to the collaborative work carried out by AGEPI and the EUIPO. The publication by AGEPI of the Practice Paper is the final result of this activity, within the EUIPO's [International Cooperation](#) [3] framework.
