The State Agency on Intellectual Property (AGEPI) participated from February 8 to 9, 2024, in the International Scientific Conference “Yesterday’s Cultural Heritage - Implications for the Development of Tomorrow’s Sustainable Society”, 9th edition, organized by the Academy of Sciences of Moldova. This conference was held in the context of marking the International Day of Women and Girls in Science and took place in a hybrid format in Iasi, Chisinau and Lviv.

The event focused on a topic of major importance promoted by UNESCO since 2015: the appreciation and recognition of the role of women in science, innovation, technology and art.
